This misconception can lead to underestimating the problem, even while hateful acts and expressions targeting Jews and Israelis continue to proliferate worldwide.

Misinformation, along with a lack of understanding of Jewish history, Israeli history, and the broader Israeli-Palestinian context, further compounds the problem. By providing historical background, contemporary examples, and tools for practical engagement, this resource list is designed to deepen understanding of these topics and all their complexity.

This section encourages nuanced understanding and critical thinking about a contentious and often polarizing topic. The items listed are not an endorsement of a particular position or ideology but rather this list is an attempt to explore the complexity of Israeli and Palestinian history, narratives, conflicts, and the geopolitical context and influence of Iran and its proxies.

Each of these sources has a political position which informs its viewpoints. Even when your own beliefs don't align with a given political position, we believe it can be extraordinarily insightful to read as widely as possible.

Current Relevance: Addresses recent events and their impact on antisemitism and regional dynamics.

While Al Jazeera provides extensive coverage on global issues, it's important to note that the network is funded by the Qatari government and often reflects a biased perspective in its reporting. Recently, the Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) [accused six Al Jazeera journalists in Gaza of being members of Hamas and Palestinian Islamic Jihad](#), alleging they used their media roles to further the agendas of these groups, raising questions about the objectivity and reliability of the network as a whole. In May 2024, the Israeli government unanimously voted to shut down Al Jazeera's operations within the country, citing national security concerns. Israeli authorities accused the network of incitement and alleged links to Hamas. In January 2025, the Palestinian Authority temporarily suspended Al Jazeera's broadcasts, accusing the network of disseminating "inciting material" and "stirring strife." This suspension followed Al Jazeera's coverage of clashes between PA security forces and militants in the Jenin refugee camp. The PA's decision reflects its dissatisfaction with the network's reporting, which it perceives as biased.
